Lockdown Drill-

We are required to practice a minimum of two lockdown drills per year. Classroom teachers and specialists have been reviewing lockdown procedures with students. We will be practicing our first drill on Tuesday, March 11th. Students will be informed prior to the start of the drill so as not to surprise them. Guidance:

K-2 students have been working on the Zones of Regulation, conflict resolution skills, and bullying prevention. Ask your student to explain what it means to be in the blue, green, yellow, or red zone!

Students in grades 3-6 have been learning about issues of acceptance and equality in an effort to increase safety in our school. Starting with the final line of the Pledge of Allegiance "...with liberty and justice for all", students have explored historical events that challenged that ideal; from the civil war, to the civil rights movement, to current issues in America and around the world. Whenever there is a person or a group of people who believe that they are better and deserve more/better at the cost of another, there is an issue that needs to be addressed. Each grade level then connected the events they studied to our current school and community experience, to better understand that all people should have the same opportunities.
